

UNIT REQUIREMENT FOR A BACHELOR'S DEGREE - Minimum of 120 units

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE – 54 units - 39 units in Criminal Justice; 12 units of Related Fields; and 3 units in English to satisfy the upper-division writing requirement

Minimum GPA and Course Grades: To earn a bachelor's in Criminal Justice, you must earn a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the major; and,

- Fall 2013 catalog year to Fall 2018, a grade of C or better in required and elective criminal justice (CRJU) courses
- Fall 2019 catalog year to present a grade of C- or better in required and elective criminal justice (CRJU) courses

Outside Units Policy: Students may take up to 9 units from accredited 4-year universities outside CSUF, provided they earn a grade of C- or higher.
